We will follow the Come and See
Programme throughout the year and
begin by looking at the theme of Love
where we will look at who loves and
cares for us, how we love and how God
shows his love for us. We will then look
closely at the theme of Vocation and
Commitment. This will allow us to spend
some time with Father Steven and
understand his role and responsibilities
as our parish priest. Moving towards
Christmas time, we will then focus on
the theme of Expectations and the
Liturgical theme of Advent where we
prepare for Jesus' coming.

Worship will commence weekly and this will allow us as class to take some quiet, reflective time to pray and think. This helps us to keep the question close to our hearts - 'What Would Jesus do?'



We will be learning about Place Value, and using all 4 operations to develop our Maths skills. We will be learning how to develop addition, subtraction, division and multiplication in a variety of worded problems including using measures and shapes. We will be working closely as Upper Key Stage 2, to ensure that the children in Year 6 are working towards Maths skills that will help them in their SATs at the end of the year.



# English



Much of our English this term will be based on the fantastic book 'Anglo Saxon Boy' by Tony Bradman. We will read this book as a class, and in our DEAR time then delve into lots of different writing, as this text offers many opportunities to showcase our English skills.

This book lends itself and links very well with our History topic this half term which is based on the question, 'What happened when the Romans left Britain?'

### HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY

'What happened when the Romans left Britain?

We are very excited about our first topic this term, it is something that has so many interesting things to discuss and find out about. Throughout the topic the children will learn all about the Anglo Saxons, who they were, where they came from and focus on their locations and settlements. We will look closely at how the Anglo Saxons lived and we will use and develop our Art and DT skills to create our own village home. We will also investigate the mystery of Sutton 'What Materials Did The Romans Use To Build?'

Through practical activities, we will explore the properties of materials. We will also consider how materials are used nowadays, and make comparisons with the use of materials during Roman Times. In addition, we will explore how materials can change and consider if these processes are reversible. Building on our prior knowledge of solids liquid and gases, we will learn how to separate mixtures using various techniques, including filtering,

We recommend that the children read every night for 20 minutes. We cannot stress enough how much your child will benefit if they read daily. They will reap the rewards!

Reading a variety of literature, both to and with your child and asking questions and discussing the text will develop comprehension and will be a huge benefit to them. It is still very important to read with and hear your child read regularly. Your child may appear to read well to themselves, but they may be mispronouncing unfamiliar words to themselves which need correcting. Also, it is always useful to discuss the content of what your child is reading.

We are always available to speak to after school or you can leave us a message in your child's journal, which is checked daily!
