The children will study different types of language and grammar used so that they can write their very own mythical stories. This will be a great opportunity for our children to unleash their creativity and dive into a realm where legends come to life!



As we progress into the Summer term, our attention will shift towards exploring concepts related to space, shape, and measurement. We will delve into the realm of angles, mastering the use of protractors. Additionally, we will concentrate on coordinates, symmetry, and translation.

Homework will be set every FRIDAY to be completed by Wednesday the following week. This will be a mixture of Grammar, Maths, handwriting and timestables. The children will receive spellings to learn ready for a test the following week. Additional to this there will be MyMaths set each Monday to Monday. Log-ins are in your Child's journal.





In our study of Ancient Greece, we will learn how a civilization that flourished over 2500 years ago still influences our lives today. We will explore the Ideas, Beliefs and Attitudes of the Ancient Greeks, and compare how Life in Athens was very different to living in Sparta. We will consider reasons for the outcome of the Battle of Marathon. Finally, we will explore the first Olympics and Greek pottery, and make further deductions about what is was like to live in this ancient society.





Our big question will be, 'Can you feel the force?' We will focus our learning on identify the effect of drag forces, such as air resistance, water resistance and friction that act between moving surfaces. As well as this, we will explore how force and motion can be transferred through mechanical devices such as gears, pulleys, levers

and springs.





Your child will receive two reading books per week. The children will have a set day that they change their books. Please sign your child's journal daily, so that we know that he/she has read to you. We recommend that the children read every night for 15 minutes. We cannot stress enough how much your child will benefit if they read daily. They will reap the

rewards!
