ENGLISH

Much of our work will be based around an adventure fiction:

Arthur and the Golden Rope

We will follow Arthur on his journey as he travels back to the age of the Vikings where he must find the courage to save his village and defeat the mighty beast, Fenrir. Once we have read this fantastic Viking myth, we will have a go at writing our own persuasive letters and mini adventure stories!

MATHS AND SCIENCE

In Maths, we will explore Fractions, Time, Money, Mass and Capacity, Decimals, Shape, Position and Direction and Statistics.

In Science, our topics will explore Plants and Living Things / Light.

We will learn how seeds are dispersed and what they need to germinate and grow. We'll also be finding out about living things and their habitats, with a focus on endangered species and how we can help protect them. We'll explore light - how it travels, how shadows are formed, and why light is important in our everyday lives.

HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY

In History, we are exploring the local history of Manchester, learning about its important role in the Industrial Revolution and how this shaped the city's growth, including the introduction of football clubs and their lasting impact on the community.

In Geography, our topic is Rivers. We will explore the features of a river, understand the water cycle and think about different ways in which we use water, as well as the impact of floods and draughts.
