GIFT Team Action Plan 2025/2026

What did we achieve last year? What difference did it make to the lives of others in our community?

- We helped Mr Proctor, Mrs Mills and Mrs Moynihan lead our VTLB assemblies each week. We help to dress the prayer focus table, explaining the meaning of each item we put on it. We read the Word of God from the Bible and may do actions or songs to help children remember parts of it. We lead the children in prayers and give out posters to each class to put on their prayer table to remind them of the virtue we are learning about. CST link-Human Dignity
- We planned and led our own liturgies linking to the Liturgical calendar. We led the whole school in worship during Advent focusing on Peace around the world and in our lives. We invited parents and parishioners to come and join us for this. We led a lovely prayer service during Lent focusing on our journey through Lent. We made each class a footprint with Bishop John Arnold's special prayer- "Stay with us Lord, on our Journey". We also visited classes and led them in prayers for October the holy rosary, new year's prayers and during May for Mary. CST link-The Common Good
- We helped Miss Burns to show some adults in school how to structure, plan and facilitate worship with a class. We planned some of our own lunch time Liturgies, inviting children from classes to join us and adults if any of them are available. CST link- Participation
- At the end of the year, we tried to start to evaluate worships in our school. We highlighted our favourite part of the worship and what we think they could tweak to improve it next time. CST link- Human Dignity
- We lead some of our school governors in a worship to help them to understand how special our time for worship is and help them to build their relationship with God as we do during our worship each week in school. CST link- Participation
