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THIS TERM, WE ARE LEARNING...

English: Much of our work will be based around *The Stone Age Boy* by Satoshi Kitamura and *The Iron Giant* by Ted Hughes. We will use the books to explore the features of a recount, write character and setting descriptions, instructional texts, newspaper reports and letter writing. We will also take part in performance poetry.

Maths: We will be learning about **place value** and developing our knowledge of the four operations; **multiplication, division, addition and subtraction.**

History and Geography: : Our History-focused topic is the Stone Age. We will understand the chronology of this fascinating time; learning about the food, religion, homes, technology and art and how each of these areas developed and changed over time. Our Geography-based topic this term is Weather and Climate. We will learn about extreme weather, its causes and effects and begin to understand the impact of human activity on the weather and climate.

Science: Our topics are Forces and Electricity. We will compare how things move on different surfaces, how a simple pulley works and use making lifting an object simpler. We will explore how some forces need contact between two objects, but magnetic forces can act at a distance and observe how magnets attract and repel each other. We will also begin to identify items that run on electricity and learn how to construct a simple series circuits We will learn about electrical safety and identify some conductors and insulators.

Religion: We will follow the Come and See scheme and our topics this term will be **Homes, Promises** and **Visitors**. Year 3 will also be working towards the Sacrament of Reconciliation. *Details of the first Parent's meeting will be provided in a separate letter.*
